To assist you in completing the required player profile, please see the criteria and grading definitions listed below.

Player Profile Criteria

With Possession - When the Team has possession and is attacking or is in attacking transition.

Positional	The Technical and Tactical attributes of the player as it relates to their ability and awareness with the ball in a 1 v 1 positional situation.
Unit	The Technical and Tactical attributes of the player as it relates to their ability and awareness in relation to their specific unit having possession. (GK & Defenders, Midfielders or Forwards).

Without Possession - When the team does not have possession and are defending or in defending transition.

Positional	The Technical and Tactical attributes of the player as it relates to their ability and awareness without the ball in a 1 v 1 positional situation.
Unit	The Technical and Tactical attributes of the player as it relates to their ability and awareness in relation to their specific unit when not having possession. (GK & Defenders, Midfielders or Forwards).

Physical	The Physical attributes of the player across, speed, strength and endurance.
Mental	The Mental attributes of the player specifically related to Attitude and Coach Ability.
